This is also called a strategy.</p> <p>The council asked people with learning disabilities what things are most important to them.</p>	<p>News about the Learning Disability Plan will come to the Partnership Board.</p> <p>The Learning Disability Plan will also be in easy read.</p>

- Housing and Support

Groups will be made up of:

- Managers and people at the council
- The Clinical commissioning group who are in charge of health care
- People with learning disabilities
- Carers, Parents and families
- Providers of services for people with learning disabilities
- Organisations that work with people with learning disabilities

Groups will listen to what people with learning disabilities say.

They will ask the Link Group for feedback and advice.

The work groups will report to the partnership board so that we can see how the plan is going.



Shannon from Speak Out gave a presentation about how this will work.

This means the Link group can ask questions and think of feedback before the meeting. 	<p>The groups will use easy words when they speak at the Partnership Board.</p> <p>Groups will give presentations in easy read.</p>
	<p>How people with learning disabilities will be part of the Partnership Board.</p> <p>Shannon gave a presentation about the Link Group.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Link Group is a group of people with learning disabilities. • They are part of planning and presenting the Partnership Board. • They talk to other people with learning disabilities about the things that matter to them. • They tell services and providers what things are like for people with learning disabilities. • This helps make services better. 	<p>The Partnership board meetings will be accessible.</p> <p>The meetings will be chaired by people with learning disabilities.</p> <p>All presentations will be in easy read.</p> <p>We will stick to the meeting rules.</p>



- Group members go to the Partnership Board meetings. They chair and present at the meetings.

- They will be making sure that the Plan is right for people with learning disabilities.
